The sites I have visited clearly explain how they process personal data. Users have the option to provide an opt-in option when sharing their data. If you choose not to provide data required for a product or feature, you may not be able to use that specific product or feature. While the privacy statement doesn't explicitly mention provisions related to children, it informs users about the nature of data collected. Unfortunately, for "Microsoft" the privacy statement does not specifically address what happens to collected personal information if the company goes out of business or is sold to another company. On the other hand, Airbnb does mention that Airbnb may share information with third-party partners and service providers, and they will continue to protect your data even in such scenarios.

Overall, for the website I've visited the Privacy Policy is comprehensive, covering various aspects of data collection, usage, and security. However, it could benefit from explicitly addressing provisions related to children and business transitions.
